A BILL

Making appropriations for Affordable Mental Health Aid to allow US Citizens from less fortunate backgrounds to have access to the necessary Mental Health Aid that they need.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Affordable Mental Health Aid Act―.".

SECTION 2. CONTINUING APPROPRIATIONS FOR MENTAL HEALTH AID.

There are hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury,

(1) Such aid as are necessary to provide treatment and assistance to such qualified US citizens of need for Affordable Mental Health Aid, including federal position including but not limited to the US Military, government officials, government officers, and thereof;

- (2) Such qualifications as are necessary to receive such Affordable Mental Health Aid are thereby to be up to the local State's discretion so long as they meet the acceptance of the majority of the US senate;
- (3) Such qualifications as are necessary to provide Affordable Mental Health Aid to US Citizens who truly cannot afford necessary aid;
- (4) Such aid as are necessary for--
- (A) The cost of a necessary mental health medication, with respect to the individual's qualifications;
- (B) The cost of a necessary therapist, with respect to the individual's qualifications;
- (C) The funding for the support of necessary suicide prevention foundation counselors or the creation of new suicide prevention foundations thereof; and
- (5) Such aid are as necessary to provide a decrease in mental health related deaths.
