IN THE SENATE OF THE AMERICAN LEGION BOYS NATION

Mr. Pichardo of Connecticut introduced the following bill;

A BILL

Requiring all citizens in the future pass a background check in order to obtain and or store any firearm.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "This act may be cited as the "Firearm Background Check Act of 2023"".

SECTION 2. Requiring background checks in order to obtain or store any and all firearms.

- (1) Only fourteen states require a background check in order to obtain a firearm with the majority of firearm sales coming from private sales that do not require background checks.
- (2) Background checks are necessary to ensure that those storing or handling firearms are mentally fit and capable for possessing a firearm additionally ensuring they do not have any criminal charges barring them from a firearm.

(3) Background checks are necessary to increase overall safety and security for firearms in the nation with ensuring all who want a firearm pass a background check to weed out those who shouldn't

have one such as-

(A) Those who have been convicted of a felony

(B) Those who are mentally unfit

(C) Those who are medically unfit

SECTION 3. Resellers and Gun Sales

All citizens who retail or resell firearms shall ensure that a proper background check is done to all clients and customers prior to the client receiving the firearm(s).

(A) Firearm retailers are required to sell to citizens who have received a background check

including but not limited to-

(1) At gun shows

(2) At firearm retail facilities

(3) At Flee Markets/Yard Sales

(4) Private Distribution or retail dealings.

SECTION 4. REPORT TO AMERICAN LEGION BOYS NATION CONGRESS

Within a year (365 days) of the enactment of this bill, the Attorney General is to submit to Congress a detailed report analyzing (if any) the effect of this Act on firearm related crime as well as any recommendation for further amendments to this act to increase gun safety through the retail of

firearms.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Act and any following amendments made by this Act shall take effect precisely two hundred

days of the enactment of this act to give sufficient time for the Attorney General and it's office's to
properly implement.
