Mr. Nelson of Nebraska submitted the following resolution;

RESOLUTION

Chinese-Made Huawei equipment atop cell towers near U.S. Military bases and critical infrastructure in the Midwest poses a threat to National Security. This technology has the capacity to capture and disrupt restricted Department of Defense Communications.

SECTION 2.

Whereas, the Chinese government has installed Chinese-made equipment atop cell towers in close proximity to the U.S. Military assets in the rural Midwest;

Whereas, this action by the Chinese raises significant concerns regarding potential national security threats, surveillance, and unauthorized access to sensitive military information;

Whereas, the Chinese Communist Party's involvement in such actions poses a risk to the United States and its interests:

Whereas, addressing this issue as a federal matter is crucial in safeguarding national security and protecting the integrity of the U.S. Military;

Whereas, counterintelligence efforts and the expertise of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) are vital in mitigating potential risks and ensuring the proper function of communication networks;

Whereas, securing funding for these endeavors is essential to effectively address this threat;

Resolved, That the Senate -

- (1) condemns the Chinese government's placement of Chinese-made equipment atop cell towers in close proximity to U.S. Military assets in the rural Midwest.
- (2) expresses its firm stance against the Chinese Communist Party's involvement in regards to the actions related to the Chinese equipment atop the cell towers.
- (3) recognizes the importance of addressing this matter as a federal issue and commits to taking appropriate actions to safeguard national security.
- (4) calls upon the U.S. Counterintelligence agencies and the FCC to collaborate closely to investigate, analyze, and mitigate potential risks posed by the Chinese-made equipment.
- (5) authorizes the allocation of federal funds to support counterintelligence efforts and the FCC in addressing the issue outlined in this resolution.
