Mr. Langum of Oklahoma introduced the following bill;

A BILL

This bill aims to limit and or ban straight party voting at the national level on nation wide ballots or legislation. It also aims to support education on bills and what the people are voting on.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Individual Voter empowerment Act".

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this act is to limit or ban straight party voting in order to encourage individual voter engagement, critical thinking, and the exercise of independent choice during elections.

SECTION 3. LIMITATION ON STRAIGHT PARTY VOTING

(a) Straight party voting, defined as the practice of casting a vote for all candidates of a particular political party with a single selection, shall be limited or banned in the United States of America on

national elections and ballots.

(b) The specifics of the limitation or ban shall be determined through the following provisions of this act.

SECTION 4. LIMITATION ON STRAIGHT PARTY VOTING

(a) Straight party voting shall be limited by requiring individual selection of candidates for each office on the ballot.

(b) The states shall provide appropriate education and outreach programs to inform voters about the limitation on straight party voting and to encourage them to make informed choices on each individual race.

SECTION 5. BAN ON STRAIGHT PARTY VOTING

(a) Straight party voting shall be banned in national ballots and elections, and voters shall be required to individually select candidates for each office on the ballot.

(b) The states shall implement measures to ensure the effective enforcement of the ban on straight party voting.

SECTION 6. VOTER EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

(a) The state governments shall develop and implement voter education and outreach programs aimed at promoting individual voter empowerment, critical thinking, and informed decision-making during elections.

(b) These programs shall include, but are not limited to, voter information campaigns, public forums, and the dissemination of educational materials to raise awareness about the importance of individual voting choices.

SECTION 7. REPEAL CLAUSE

All acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

The provisions of this act are severable, and if any part is held unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall not be affected.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall go into effect upon its passage and approval.
