Mr. Bull of Tennessee introduced the following bill;

A BILL

In addition to enforcing US Law Code 18 U.S.C 922(d) this act will promote public safety by enacting the same restrictions to firearms and thereof; to people that have or are currently receiving treatment from mental health facilities.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "The Covenant Shooting Demand for Mental Health Act 2023".

SECTION 2: DEFINITION

In this act:

- (1) Mental Health Facility- Inpatient or outpatient treatment center for mental health care.
- (2) Mental Health Provider- A professional health care practitioner who offers services for the

purpose of improving an individual's mental health or treating mental disorders.

(3)Mental Evaluations- A series of formal or structured psychological tests as well as clinical interviews designed to identify and describe emotional, behavioral, or learning problems.

SECTION 3: PROHIBITION OF SHIPPING, TRANSPORTING, RECEIVING, OR POSSESSING

FIREARMS OR AMMUNITION.

- (a) That have voluntarily or involuntarily been receiving treatment from a mental health facility.
- (b) Has ever received treatment from a mental health facility.

SECTION 4: EXCEPTIONS

These laws will be hereby terminated to those that have been listed that act upon the following orders:

- (1)For those that are voluntarily or involuntarily seeking and continuously seeking mental health treatment from a mental health facility.
- (a) The patient will have a mental health evaluation every (but not limited to) 6 months based on the evaluation of the mental health provider.
- (b)The mental health provider must maintain records every (but not limited to) 6 months for a congruent 3 years. If such patient discontinues continuous treatment a decision will be made by the Court to extend the mental evaluations to once per year.
- (2) For those that have ever received treatment from a mental health facility and/or discontinue mental health treatment from a mental health facility.

The patient will go once every (but not limited to) 12 months to a mental evaluation from a mental health provider.

By Court Order evaluations can be modified to be more frequent than 12 months.

SECTION 5: FUNDING

Appropriations and funds will be designated from the National Treasury.
